Authority Discussion Questions

- 1. Throughout this book, Kaya weighs the pros and cons of how her world has changed after the loss of trackers. Do you think this world was better off with trackers? Why or Why not? Make a weighted pros and cons list to help decide.
- 2. After the fall of the tracker network, Kaya and her friends decide to learn new skills like coding. What's a new skill you'd learn if you lived in their world?
- 3. With Harlow's memory lapses and loss of control, do you think Kaya was right to trust him and want to help him? Why or why not?
- 4. Bailen wants to use Harlow as bait without telling him in order to catch who is behind the tracker loophole. Kaya thinks it's wrong to use Harlow without his permission, to risk one person's life for the good of the many. What would you do in this situation and why?
- 5. If you were in Harlow's position, would you allow Bailen and the Ghosts to use you as bait, or not? How would you feel if that choice was taken from you?
- 6. What parallels and differences do you see between how this world has changed and our current world today?
- 7. Kaya and Peyton are on a journey of dealing with loss throughout this book. How do you believe the loss has shaped each character? How has the loss impacted their decisions?
- 8. Kaya often hides key information from people she cares about. Do you agree or disagree with her decision to keep certain things a secret? Explain why?
- 9. While Ava brings new expertise to the team, she has a very different background from the Ghosts. Did you trust her? What strengths and weaknesses do you feel she brought to the group?
- 10. The Jewish representation in Book 1 was tied more to technology, while in Book 2 was more about Jewish traditions. Which aspect of the representation did you enjoy more, and what aspects of Judaism would you like to learn more about?
- 11. What was your favorite relationship in this book and why?
- 12. What did you think of the AI in this book? Compare and contrast the AI in this book to that of today's world? Did the AI in this book impact how you feel about AI?
